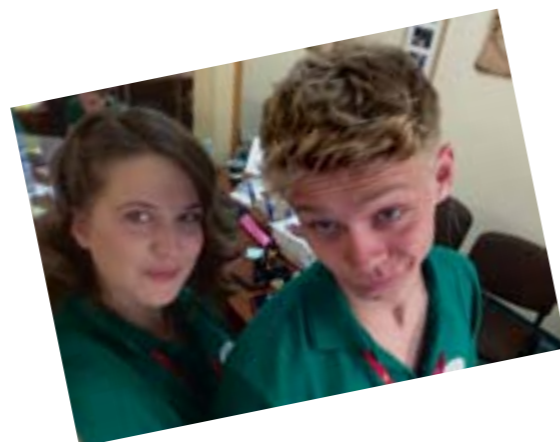
Have a look around!
